The Bible-belt churches are relatively unaffected by the secular statistics and studies which have influenced much of the rest of the country on the death penalty. Their position is that secular reporting of the problems with the American death penalty has no bearing on God's will as reflected in God's Word. As opposed to moving away from the death penalty, like the rest of Americans, the conservative evangelical Christians in the Bible-belt are digging in to defend the veracity of the Bible by defending the American death penalty.

"... In the summer of 2000, even as other conservatives voiced their doubts, the increasingly fundamentalist Southern Baptist Convention explicitly endorsed capital punishment for the first time ..." a

This religious fervor is significant. The death penalty, as practiced in America today, is a Bible-belt phenomenon." b
